

AM Sermon Notes

Text: Acts 13:1-13

Title: The Call to Missions

Central Truth: Within the context of the local Church at Antioch, the Holy Spirit calls Barnabas and Paul to the ministry of missions which results in a Roman Official being brought to saving faith in Jesus.

vv. 1-3 I. The Commission-Luke begins by mentioning the local Church! God works in and through His Churches.

v. 1 Luke mentions two types of spiritual gifts and spiritual leaders:

1. prophets-more of a forth-teller than fore-teller

2. teachers-explain and apply Biblical truth to people's lives

v. 2 NASB-**set apart for me**, KJV-**separate me**-a command

This is God's divine call and initiative!

v. 3 Here we see a commissioning service. The Church recognized Paul and Barnabas's call to missions. NASB, KJV-**they sent them away**-the verb used here means to release them from their duties.

vv. 4-11 II. The Confrontation

v. 4 Cyprus-a large island about 60 miles off the coast of Syria.

v. 6 NASB-**magician**, KJV-**sorcerer** (Greek-magos) it gives us our English word magic. This man was a deceiver and a trickster!

v. 8 This is spiritual warfare on the frontline.

v. 9 From this point on Luke always refers to **Saul** by his Roman name **Paul**.

v. 10 NASB-**deceit**, KJV-**subtilty**-literally it means to set a trap by using bait.

v. 12 III. The Conversion

The miracle of blindness that Paul worked on the sorcerer helped Sergius to believe in the Gospel. However, the miracle alone didn't cause him to be saved because the main factor was Paul's teaching on the Lord!

v. 13 IV. The Castaway

For some unknown reason, John Mark deserted Paul and Barnabas and returned home to Jerusalem.

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
