



**THE GLORIOUS GOSPEL**

**Text:** Romans 1:16-17

**Central Truth:** As Christians, we have good news to share with the world that we can be made right with God through faith in Jesus.

**v.16** **I. The Power of the Gospel**

**Gospel** (Greek – *euangelion*) It means good news or good message. This word gives us our English words such as evangelism or evangelical.

**Power** (Greek – *dunamis*) It gives us the word dynamite. It speaks of having great power or force. Yet, unlike dynamite - which is a destructive power - the Gospel has a delivering, converting, soul transforming, divine power!

**Believes** – Saving faith is more than just a mental thing. It is placing our faith, trust in Jesus!

**v.17** **II. The Provision of the Gospel**

**Righteousness of God** – Unlike us, righteousness is one of God’s main attributes. Here, Paul is referring to the righteousness or right standing that God gives to us.

**Revealed** (Greek – *apokalupto*) It means to uncover, to unveil. The Gospel is not something that people just naturally know, can figure out, or discover on their own. Salvation comes to us by a transaction through faith (cf. *Habakkuk 2:4*). At the moment of conversion, God does a swap-out. He transfers, credits, imputes Jesus’ righteousness to us while transferring our sin to Jesus’ account.

**Three Tenses in Salvation**

1. **Past:** (*Justification*) – saved from the **penalty** of sin
2. **Present:** (*Sanctification*) – saved from the **power** of sin
3. **Future:** (*Glorification*) – saved from the **presence** of sin
