Text: 1 Kings 18:41-46

Central Truth: Fervent prayer connects us to the God of all power.

vv. 41-42a I. The Instructions

cf. James 5:16b-18

v.41 Apparently Ahab was not affected by God's victory on Mt. Carmel. So therefore, Elijah orders him to do what spiritually dead people do. They satisfy and indulge the desires of the flesh. Unlike Ahab, Elijah was looking through the spiritual eyes of faith!

v.42a Ahab had no mind whatsoever, to turn to Yahweh. Ahab stands as a timeless example of our unbelieving world today which has no mind for the things of God.

vv. 42b-44 II. The Intercession

v.42b Here we see a huge difference between Ahab and Elijah. While Ahab stuffs his face, Elijah is seeking God's face! Elijah's first **priority** was to do the will of God (cf. John 4). Also, Elijah's **posture** reveals his heart of submission and humility.

v.43 Elijah is persistent in his praying!

v.44 NASB & NIV – **small**, KJV – **little** (Hebrew – *qatan*) It means to be little or insignificant. This didn't look like much to the servant but Elijah was looking through the eyes of faith!

vv. 45-46 III. The Intervention

v.45 NASB – **heavy shower**, KJV – **great rain**, NIV – **heavy rain**

This is actually the same word used in the book of Jonah for the great fish! Obviously, the sovereign hand of God and not Baal controlled the weather!

v.46 God supernaturally empowered Elijah for the 17-mile run back to Jezreel.

vv. 41-42a I. The Instructions
