

AM Sermon Notes

Text: Matthew 20:29-34

Title: Sight for Two Souls

Central Truth: Jesus' healing of physical blind eyes gives us a picture of salvation which is the opening of spiritual blind eyes.

(cf. Mark 10:46-52; Luke 18:35-43)

vv.29-30 **I. The Crying Ones**

v.29 Jericho is about 14 or 15 miles east of Jerusalem. It was an oasis in the barren wilderness near the Dead Sea.

v.30 In both Mark and Luke's Gospels, we learn that the blindness of these two men had reduced them to the status of begging for a living. Their physical condition is a picture of lost, unsaved people who are separated from Jesus and His salvation!

NASB, KJV – **cried out**, NIV – **shouted** (Greek – krazo); this is a strong, emphatic verb. It means to cry out loud, to scream.

Son of David – a Messianic title

v.31 **II. The Calloused Ones**

This crowd really didn't care about these two men. They didn't want to be bothered by them! The secular world always wants to shut up and shut out true Christianity. Yet, we can never stop sharing the Gospel.

vv.32-34 **III. The Compassionate One**

v.32 Jesus does three things:

1. **He stopped** - _____
2. **He called** - _____
3. **He asks a question** - _____

v.34 NASB – **moved with compassion** – this literally refers to the moving of the intestines! It speaks of a deep, strong internal emotional feeling (cf. Luke 15:20).

Cf. Mark 10:52, Jesus not only opened their physical blind eyes, but He also opens their spiritual, blind souls! They receive the gift of eternal salvation.

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
